A project earning a grade in the 103-114 (206-228) range is considered good work.

A project earning a grade of 115 (230) or higher must contain multiple areas demonstrating **exceptional** work. Simply doing a good job completing the project does not automatically earn a score in this range.

Assessment scales for various #-point criteria...
