A project earning a grade of 115 (230) or higher must contain multiple areas demonstrating **exceptional** work. Simply doing a good job completing the project does not automatically earn a score in this range.

Assessment scales for various #-point criteria...

0	0	0	0	No attempt at addressing the criteria is evident.
0	0.5	1	1-2	An attempt at addressing the criteria is evident; however, the implementation is unsuccessfully or incorrectly executed.
0.5	1	2-3	3-4	Criteria is executed, implemented, or addressed with minimal success and/or execution is well below a reasonable standard of expectation.
0.5	1.5	4-5	5-7	Criteria is marginally executed, implemented, or addressed with apparent room for improvement.
1	2	6-7	8-9	Criteria is successfully executed, implemented, or addressed to an acceptable standard of expectation. Typical "good" score.
1	2	8	10	Criteria is fully and successfully executed, implemented, or addressed to or beyond the highest standard of expectation. Has "wow factor."

Final Course Grade is determined by the Course Project Score x 2.
